Freedom Park Update



A lot of buzz has been created by the building going up next to the police station. A couple of years ago, it was decided to turn that piece of property into Freedom Park. We have been using the property for many City events including Heritage Day, Christmas tree lighting and caroling, and Police Night Out. This has been a work in progress and improvements made as money and donations were received. There are no city tax dollars being used for this project.

To get Freedom Park to the point it is at now, the area was first laid with underground sprinklers and grass, later came a donated flag pole, and finally, the fencing and cement pad were installed. Now a community bandstand is being built. It is our hope that this will be a hometown focal point for residents, bringing back an era of community gatherings and a true 'down home' feeling. There will be additional future improvements to the area, such as landscaping, a sidewalk, and a sign.

We hope to dedicate the park in the spring.



Let's Keep Harrington Safe and Clean Avoid these **Common Code Violations**

Prohibited Weed Growth - Grass must be kept at maximum height of 6"

Prohibited Deposits of Trash - Trash and other debris must be removed from yard

External Placement of Interior Furniture -Couches, mattress, appliances, etc. are not allowed to be placed outside (see "Spring Clean Up Week" (front page) for disposal info) Parking in Front & Side Yards - Vehicles must be parked in the driveway or rear yard of a house or on the street as allowed

Structure Address Numbering - Building numbers must be visible from street

Abandoned Vehicles – Vehicles must be registered and tagged by the DMV

Trash Cans - Trash cans must be removed from the curb to a point not visible from the street by 11:59 pm the day trash is collected

Utility Bills Due May 10

Community Cats Trap, Neuter, Return Program

Harrington's partnership with the Delaware SPCA, the Humane Society, and Alley Cat Allies has resulted in the trapping of 256 feral cats in the Harrington community. The success of this program is in large part due to the hard work of volunteers.

The Trap, Neuter, Return (TNR) program captures feral cats and transports them to the Delaware SPCA where they are spayed or neutered and vaccinated for rabies. The cats are then returned to the location where they were trapped. A caretaker monitors a colony of feral cats to ensure the health of the animals and trap any new cats or kittens to be neutered and vaccinated. The community benefits from the TNR program, because spaying and neutering reduces or eliminates the nuisance behaviors of the feral cats and the overall cat population decreases as no new kittens are born.
