



Warm weather means yard work. Please remember that the City's Code requires that grass be 6" or less in height. Grass clippings must be cleared from the sidewalk & street as soon as mowing is complete. Yard waste cannot be placed in with regular household garbage but can be dropped off at the Public Works Yard during Spring Clean Up Week (see below) or on Wednesdays, 9 am-3 pm (hours extended in the summer).

Photo ID is required as proof of residency. Tires, paint, and batteries will not be accepted. Appliances must have the Freon removed by a technician certified to do so and tagged as such. 

#### Fire Pits & Grills

City Council adopted Ordinance 15-01 to clarify the Open Burning Chapter of the City Code. Previously, no burning was allowed; now, fires up to 18" and contained in a fire ring or fire pit are allowed. Still prohibited is the burning of structures, brush, and bonfires. Grills are prohibited on balconies of multi-family dwellings. Please always be safe with fires, keep them clear of combustible materials and have a fire extinguisher ready.
