

#### **Grass Cutting & Yard Waste**

Warm weather means yard work. Please remember that the City's Code requires that grass be 6" or less in height. Grass clippings must be cleared from the sidewalk & street as soon as mowing is complete. Yard waste cannot be placed in with regular household garbage but can be dropped off at the Public Works Yard during Spring Clean Up Week (see above) or on Wednesdays, 9 am - 3 pm (9 am - 5:30 pm starting May 10). Do not blow grass clippings into the street! Debris on the streets washes into the storm drains & clogs them leading to



#### What happened to the big recycling cans at WT Chipman?

The Delaware Solid Waste Authority (DSWA) provided the drop-off recycling centers at various sites throughout the state. Between decreased demand (because of curbside recycling), illegal dumping at the sites, and recyclables being contaminated with household trash, the DSWA reduced the drop-off recycling centers to only DSWA facilities. As part of the City's trash collection service, residents are provided a can for recyclables that is collected every other week.

## Downtown Development District

The City of Harrington was designated by the State as a Downtown Development District (DDD) on August 10, 2016. This means that investors in the DDD can qualify for rebate grants for construction costs and other incentives. The City adopted both DDD specific and citywide incentives to encourage growth.
