Winter Reminders

With the onset of lower temperatures and winter weather, here are a few things to keep in mind:

- Pipes may freeze & cause leaks. Know where the master shut-off valve is located in your house, or have one installed, to save water & prevent damage.
- Snow & ice must be removed from sidewalks along your property within 24 hours of snowfall ending. Don't throw snow onto streets.
- Remove hoses from outside spigots to prevent freezing.
- If possible, don't park cars on the street during snowfall.
