Snow Reminders

Winter is coming. Keep in mind the following snow related

- Snow & ice must be removed from sidewalks along your property within 24 hours of snowfall ending. Please do not throw snow onto streets.
- If possible, do not park cars on the street during snowfall to allow the plows to clear the streets.

Cold Weather Water Reminders

- Know where the master shut-off valve is located in your house, or have one installed, to save water & prevent water damage in case of frozen/leaking pipes.
- Remove hoses from outside spigots to prevent freezing.
- Water is metered, so there will be a charge for water left running to prevent frozen pipes.

Quarterly Tax Bills

Any property that has a permit pulled with the City of Harrington may be subject to a quarterly tax bill. Quarterly tax bills are billed in October, January, and April.

Please call (302) 398-4428 to see if you need a building permit.

Only City of Harrington employees are allowed to access water meter pits. Call City Hall for water turn on/off.
