TRASH INCREASE

Effective immediately: An extra trash container will increase to \$34.44 per quarter.

Greater Harrington Historical Society

The Greater Harrington Historical Society is actively presenting and preserving Harrigton's history. With a huge thank you to Crystal Trust for a \$100,000 grant, we will soon start a restoration of the former St. Stephens Episcopal church, which services as one of our three museums. The project includes replacing the stained-glass windows and a complete restoration of the exterior. The work will be completed prior to Heritage Day, so look for a special ceremony that day celebrating the project. Get ready to do the Blue Hen Boogie! Or maybe the Shag! During the mid-1950's to the early 1960's, Harrington was home to Blue Hen Records, owned by Sam Short. Thanks to a grant from Delaware Humanities, we are producing a documentary, in conjunction with 302 Stories of Wilmington, to tell this amazing story. Then on June 15th, 2024, we will be hosting a premier of this video. Location TBD. Kids Day at the Caboose will be occurring again! The date is June 8, 2024, from 10am to 2pm.
